She said that the effect on those receiving the boxes should not be under-estimated. Faye went on to describe the work she and the team undertake and some of their successes.

In his vote of thanks, host for the day Nigel Little confirmed that the final count for the Reverse Advent Boxes was over 200 of which 63 were given by Rotarians; Schools & Colleges – 76; Friends (Non-Rotary) – 38;

Total = 177 Boxes.....then over 30 more were put together from the 65 bags of individual donations received.... total value estimated at over £10,000. Well done Nigel and everyone else too.
